Comparison of Traditional v. Progressive Church

This is a snapshot of the points involved within the discussion of disaffiliation from the UMC

On August 28, 2022, 109 professing members of Royse City First United Methodist church joined together for a straw poll to discuss the possibility of disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church. The vote passed at 77% with 84 voting to disaffiliate and 25 voting not to disaffiliate.

What does the current book of discipline say?

Inclusiveness - ¶ 4 & 104 and Eligibility ¶ 214

"...all persons are of sacred worth created in the image of God"

"...all persons may attend its worship services participate in its programs, receive the sacraments and become members in any local church in the connection."

Human sexuality - ¶161.G

"...does not condone the practices of homosexuality and considered this practice incompatible with Christian teaching."

Marriage - ¶161.G

"...whether or not they are married, sexual relations are confirmed only with the covenant of monogamous heterosexual marriage."

Ordination of Ministers \$304 & 2702

"...self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be considered as candidates ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in the United Methodist Church.

Current state of UMC Governance

Human sexuality language has been voted on and kept in the Book of Discipline by a majority vote at General Conference for 50 years

Book of Discipline is not followed in many churches and conferences

Book of Discipline is not enforced by current leadership

No accountability for violations of the Book of Discipline

Causing Harm

Conflict is hurting our witness to others

Causing fear and confusion in the body of Christ

Disrupting the mission and ministries of the church

Distracting focus of the church

Differences of Opinion

The wide range of disagreements about theology, human sexuality, and the interpretation of scripture illustrates how deep our divide has become. Both sides believe their understanding of the Bible is correct.

The purpose of this information is not to persuade, but rather present the issues confronting our denomination today.

Your church's future will be decided by the professing members of the church.

What if some of my beliefs are in both views?

Prayerfully consider how important each belief is in your faith walk

Read scripture related to the belief/topic

Ask Pastor Chris, Pastor Frances or a spiritual mentor questions

Pray

This is so important to the life of our church. Please above all spend time in prayer asking God for direction. He will answer.

Philippians 4:6 - Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

What is next -

A discussion will occur with leaders from the church and our DS and Assistant to the Bishop.
We will perform a cost-analysis to see the cost associated with disaffiliation and joining another denomination.

3. We will research to see which denomination best fits our congregation and our reach into our community and world.

4. Hold an official charge conference vote to approve disaffiliation and another vote to affiliate with another Methodist/Wesleyan denomination.

What does voting yes mean - We will be leaving the United Methodist Church. After completing the disaffiliation process, we will have total ownership of our property. We will then join with another Methodist/Wesleyan denomination and be in connection with them. Their polity would become our polity.
